The worker will provide home visiting, referrals to other support services and wellness and cultural programming to individuals and groups.

- Provide appropriate individual and group services for clients
- Provide referrals to and work with other professionals to support the client in their journey, such as; the Mental Health Therapist, NNADAP Coordinator, Wellness Worker, Cultural Coordinator
