Guided by nehiyaw values—wîcihitowin (helping one another), wâhkôhtowin (kinship), tâpwêwin (honesty), tapahtêyimisowin (humility), and kistêyih tamowin (wisdom)—we are committed to providing safe, respectful, and culturally grounded health services for our citizens.

We are seeking a compassionate and community-focused **Maternal Child Health Worker** to provide prevention-based, family-centred outreach and practical supports to pregnant individuals, new parents, infants, children, and families in the community. This role also provides non-clinical home care and daily living supports to help strengthen wellness, safety, and stability within the home.

What You Will Do: Reporting to the Health Services Manager, the Maternal Child Health Worker provides culturally grounded home visiting, parenting and early childhood wellness education, basic non-clinical home care supports, and service navigation assistance for families and community members. This role supports healthy pregnancies, safe newborn care, early childhood development, and safe home environments through prevention, early intervention, and coordinated referrals. The Worker maintains respectful relationships with families, supports access to community and external services, completes required documentation, and carries out duties using trauma-informed, strengths-based, and culturally safe approaches.

Who You Are: You are a caring, reliable, and values-driven community helper who enjoys supporting children and families in a respectful and practical way. You bring strong communication skills, professional boundaries, and a commitment to confidentiality and wellness. You understand the importance of trauma-informed practice and cultural safety, and you provide support with humility, compassion, and integrity.

You Bring:

- High school diploma or equivalent, post-secondary training in community wellness, early childhood development, family support work, human services, or related fields is an asset.
- Experience supporting children, families, Elders, or community wellness programs.
- Understanding of nehiyaw culture, community protocols and trauma-informed practice, confidentiality, and professional boundaries.
- Strong communication and relationship-building skills.
- Ability to work independently, complete documentation, and follow program procedures.
- Demonstrates integrity, reliability, compassion, professionalism, a positive attitude and a willingness to learn, grow and work respectfully with families and community members.
- Respects confidentiality and demonstrates trustworthiness.
- Commitment to culturally safe, trauma-informed, and client-centred service delivery.

Conditions of Employment:

- Valid Class 5 Driver’s Licence, clean driver’s abstract, and access to a reliable insured vehicle.
- Clear Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Search.
- First Aid and CPR certification, or willingness to obtain within a specified timeframe.
- Must successfully pass a drug and alcohol screening prior to start date and adhere to all kakisiwew-ochapowace Nation workplace policies.
