At kakisiwew-ochapowace Nation, our people are our greatest strength. Guided by nehiyaw values—wīcihitowin (helping one another), tāpwēwin (honesty), tapahtēyimisowin (humility), and kistēyihtamowin (wisdom)—we are committed to building safe, respectful, and culturally grounded communities for our citizens.

We are seeking a **Prevention Manager for a 12 month term** to provide strategic leadership for prevention, early intervention, community justice coordination, peacekeeping oversight, and animal control services within Child & Family Services. This management role plays a critical part in reducing risk, strengthening protective factors, and supporting families before statutory intervention thresholds are reached, in alignment with the Nation's laws, Child & Family Services mandate, and prevention-first approach.

What You Will Do: Reporting to the Director, Child & Family Services, the Prevention Manager will lead prevention and early-intervention services that strengthen children, families, and community safety. The role provides strategic oversight of prevention programming, justice coordination, peacekeeping, and animal control, ensuring services are culturally grounded, trauma-informed, and aligned with Nation laws and Child & Family Services mandates. The Prevention Manager leads policy development, staff supervision, budgeting and funder reporting, partnership building, and performance monitoring, while fostering a respectful, accountable, and prevention-first workplace culture rooted in nehiyaw values.

Who You Are: You are a values-driven leader with strong judgment, cultural humility, and a commitment to prevention, family well-being, and Nation jurisdiction. You are comfortable leading complex, multidisciplinary teams and navigating sensitive child, family, justice, and community safety matters with professionalism and care.

You Bring:

- Diploma or degree in Social Work, Child & Youth Care, Indigenous Studies, Community Development, Justice, Public Administration, or a related field or a relevant combination of education, training and experience will be considered.
- Minimum five (5) years of progressive experience in child and family services, prevention, justice, or community safety, including at least three (3) years in a management or supervisory role.
- Demonstrated experience working within or alongside statutory child and family services systems.
- Strong leadership, policy development, budgeting, and people management skills.
- Knowledge of prevention frameworks, restorative justice, trauma-informed practice, and Indigenous approaches to child and family well-being.
- Experience working in First Nations or Indigenous community settings is a strong asset.
- Excellent communication, collaboration, and decision-making skills.
- Exercises sound judgment, discretion, and professionalism when managing sensitive information, high-risk situations, and competing priorities and remains calm in emotionally charged or crisis situations.
- Leads with humility, accountability, and fairness, modelling respectful conduct and ethical leadership for staff and community partners.
